The Charles Bass Correctional Complex (CBCX) site is the reception, classification, and diagnostic center for male felons committed from the Middle Tennessee area.

The Annex site houses minimum custody inmates who are within five years of release with an emphasis on community reintegration. The Genesis Transition Community, a 90-bed therapeutic community program, is offered at the annex. Genesis follows a model that promotes awareness, responsibility and accountability.

The Charles Bass Correctional Complex provides over 150,000 hours of community service work a year to state and local government and non-profit agencies in Davidson County and surrounding areas.

**I**nmates participate in academic and vocational programs, mental health programs, and various work programs much as they do at TDOC owned and operated facilities.

**T**wo TDOC staff are located on site to monitor contract compliance and provide for those functions not delegatable to private entities under state law.

**T**he Lois M. DeBerry Special Needs Facility (DSNF) provides a number of services for the department including acute and convalescent health care, intensive mental health intervention, a therapeutic program for sex offenders, and departmental pharmaceutical services.

**T**wo skilled nursing units in the Health Center provide care for inmates recovering from surgery, serious illness, or housing for inmates whose treatment regimen is not manageable at other TDOC facilities. There is also a rehabilitation unit that houses inmates with long-term medical needs.

**D**SNF contracts with a community hospital to provide inpatient and outpatient care for the inmate population in a designated, secure area. Other hospitals are also utilized for specialized care not available in the contract hospital.

**S**pecialty clinics, short-stay surgeries, individual treatment and diagnostic services not available at other facilities are provided to the inmates from all facilities through the transient unit, health center, and contract staff at DSNF.

Mark H. Luttrell Correctional Center (MLCC) is one of two female facilities in the state prison system. Opened in 1976 as a male institution, the facility was converted for females in June, 1999. 120 of the institution's bed capacity is designated a minimum security annex. The remainder is designated as close security.

Major programs include educational and library services, counseling, job assignments, religious services and medical/mental health services as well as support group programs such as Alcoholics Anonymous, therapeutic community programs, and drug education.

Morgan County Correctional Complex (MCCX) first opened in September 1980. A major expansion of the complex is under way with completion slated for January, 2009. Upon completion, the facility will house 2,441 inmates. This will result in a 3.6 million dollar savings to the state once inmates are transferred from the Brushy Mountain Correctional Complex.

Several employment opportunities are available at the Morgan County Correctional Complex. These positions include vocational instructors, academic teachers, counselors, nursing staff, correctional officers, unit manager and food service staff.

The "Impact of Crime on Victims" program has now graduated more than 60 people. The program was made possible in part through a grant from the National Institute of Corrections.

MCCX also boasts an 81.4% pass rate on GED testing for inmates.

Alcohol and drug treatment programs are available through a modified therapeutic community. Inmates receive 300 hours of treatment for 30 weeks.

Community Service crews from MCCX provide thousands of hours of labor to local government and non-profit organizations each year.

Northeast Correctional Complex (NECX) is a time-building institution with a maximum security designation. The facility also houses inmates of other custody levels. Three hundred inmates are located at the minimum annex site in Johnson County, and another 180 inmates, who are within ten years of their eligible release date, are housed in Carter County.

NECX offers intensive counseling programs for drugs and anger management. Approximately 60 inmates currently participate in those. Both sites operate extensive community service programs, which provide thousands of hours of skilled and unskilled labor to state and local government, as well as non-profit agencies in East Tennessee. A recent report shows that NECX work crews saved taxpayers more than \$100,000 in the month of July alone.

NECX has three industries which are operated by [TRICOR](#). The data plant employs approximately 50 inmates, the printing plant employs 25 inmates, and the sewing plant employs 50 inmates.

The Northwest Correctional Complex (NWCX) site is one of three prototypically designed facilities in Tennessee. The Lake County Regional Correctional Facility (LCRCF) site is the primary educational institution for the TDOC. The educational program includes special education services, Adult Basic Education, preparation for GED testing, Title 1, and vocational education programs.

Due to the lack of industry at NWCX, focus has been placed on education and community service. Over 100,000 hours of community service work are provided to state and local government and non-profit agencies each year by this complex.

Riverbend Maximum Security Institution (RMSI) opened in 1989 and replaced its 100 year-old neighbor, the Tennessee State Penitentiary. Even today, it's billed as one of the state's most high-tech facilities. RMSI, which is made up of 20 different buildings, sits on 132 acres located off Cockrill Bend Boulevard. Riverbend's designated capacity is 736 offenders. Of that number, 480 are classified as high risk.

The prison's overall mission is to ensure the safety of the public, departmental employees and inmates by managing high-risk male offenders. Ricky Bell, who is a 37-year veteran of the department, has been the warden at Riverbend since March of 1995. Education programs at the prison include GED and Adult Basic Education. [TRICOR](#), the prison industry, also manages a data entry plant and print shop at the prison. Inmates who are not involved in academic, vocation, or industry programs are required to work in support service roles throughout the facility.

South Central Correctional Facility (SCCF) is a time-building institution with a security designation of medium. SCCF is managed by Corrections Corporation of America, a private corrections management firm.

One 94 bed unit is designated for a Step Up/Step Down Mental Health Program, as well as a Challenger Self Help Program. Other mental health services include Pre-Sex Offender Treatment Program, aftercare and HIV support groups, residential substance abuse program, and self improvement program. Academic programs include GED, Adult Basic Education and literacy tutoring. Vocational programs include building trades, industrial cleaning, horticulture, upholstery, electrical, plumbing, and computer operations.

Southeastern Tennessee State Regional Correctional Facility (STSRCF) is a time-building institution with a medium security designation. It is situated on approximately 2,200 acres approximately 15 miles from Pikeville, Tennessee.

The industrial plant at STSRCF is managed and operated by [TRICOR](#) and is involved in manufacturing items for free world corporations. Inmates employed by the industries plant are involved in the Prison Industry Enhancement (PIE) Program which provides inmates the minimum wage rate of pay plus production incentive. Inmate assigned to this program must contribute a substantial percentage of their earnings to the state for room/board, forced savings, victim restitution, and taxes. Additionally managed by [TRICOR](#) is STSRCF's farm comprised of approximately 2,200 acres. The farm is involved with milk and limited beef production.

The Tennessee Prison for Women (TPFW), located in Nashville, is the primary facility for female felons in the state. It is a reception and classification center for female offenders entering into the TDOC system. The prison also houses inmates in all custody levels, including pre-release participants, work release inmates, and those women sentence to death. The security designation is maximum. TRICOR provides job opportunities through the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP) test distribution center, and the TennCare hotline. The YWCA collaborates with the department to operate a 40 bed job readiness/life skills therapeutic transitional program.

TPFW offers a weekend [child visitation program](#) which has received national recognition. The program includes grandmothers as well as mothers. TPFW has a dog training program called [PPAWS or Prison Puppies Achieving Worthy Service](#), that is designed to help rehabilitate inmates while teaching them a marketable job skill.

Turney Center Industrial Prison (TCIP) is a time-building institution with emphasis on industry. The security designation is close. The majority of beds are medium security.

Academic programs available at the facility include GED and Adult Basic Education. Vocational programs include cosmetology, cabinet making and mill work, industrial maintenance, landscaping, vocational office education, commercial food services, and commercial cleaning. [TRICOR](#) industry programs include the wood, metal, and school specialties. Inmates are also involved in support jobs at the facility.

In December 1989, the Wayne County Boot Camp (WCBC) was reorganized as a special alternative incarceration unit commonly referred to as the "boot camp." The boot camp is a highly disciplined, military style program combined with various treatment programs. Eligible offenders are 35 years of age or under and convicted of non-violent crimes with sentences of six years or less. Some inmates convicted of certain drug offenses with a sentence not greater than 12 years may also be considered for the boot camp. The program is operated as minimum security.

Military training consists of drill and ceremony, physical training, and respect for authority. Available programs include adult basic education and pre-release. Discipline is a vital part of this program. Inmates participate in the boot camp program for 90 to 120 days. After successfully completing the program, inmates are released to probation supervision.

In February 1993, the mission of the boot camp was modified to include 50 beds for geriatric inmates. Geriatric inmates must be 55 years of age or older and be able to participate in a work program. These inmates provide labor for community service projects and must be minimum direct or minimum trusty custody level.
